A celebration of courage

On 17 December 2020 we were grateful for the opportunity to celebrate the achievements of the 2020 Triple Care Farm graduates.

While COVID forced the ceremony online, the love, pride and admiration for these young people certainly still shone through.

During the ceremony, Sir David Martin Foundation Board Chair, Captain Will Martin acknowledged the resilience of the young people who completed the withdrawal and residential rehabilitation programs in 2020.

"We know you've had to fight through a lot this year... illness, addiction, your insecurities and uncertainties, not to mention a global pandemic," said Will.

"But fought through you have... and you've done so with perseverance, commitment and most of all you've done it with courage.

Graduates also received heartfelt video messages from Lady Martin and Mission Australia's CEO James Toomey, with Triple Care Farm staff members addressing each student with personalised messages of support.

Area Manager Gabriella Holmes highlighted the students' "audacity, boldness and true grit" in choosing to change their lives.

"Your sturdy determination has written your story of change. This year like no



Thanks Mike Crowley



Towards the end of 2020 we fondly celebrated retiring Board Chair Mike Crowley, who has made an outstanding contribution to our Foundation's growth and ongoing capacity to support vulnerable young Australians in crisis.

During his 10-year board tenure (the past six as Chair), Mr Crowley played a pivotal role in strengthening the Foundation's philanthropic partnership with Mission Australia's Triple Care Farm. Notably, this includes the commissioning of David Martin Place – NSW's first purpose built youth

residential withdrawal facility, which officially opened in 2017.

Captain Will Martin RAN (Rtd), a current board member and son of Sir David Martin and Lady (Suzanne) Martin, succeeds Mr Crowley as Board Chair.

Will paid tribute to Mr Crowley's contribution to the Board, saying that his business acumen, steady leadership and commitment to helping young people have been invaluable.

"Mike's influence on the culture of this organisation has been quite palpable," said Will.

"His personal values, particularly around humility, open mindedness, generosity and empathy resonate across the organisation and are felt by all – from the Board of Governors, staff and all the way to the young people at Triple Care Farm."

Mike and his wife Chrissie continue to be valued supporters of the Foundation and we sincerely thank them for their commitment and help over so many years.



Bright start to 2021

As 2021 kicks off there's plenty of positivity at Triple Care Farm. Lots of Summer rain has been good for the gardens, and is keeping both the grounds staff and student gardeners very busy - especially in the veggie patch! The past 12 months saw many COVID-enforced operational changes at the farm. It's a testament to staff that they adapted so effectively and continued to offer a safe place for change throughout this challenging time. As of February 2021, we are pleased to report that student intake restrictions are easing and will move back towards pre-COVID capacity, as long as it stays safe to do so. Staff are delivering the programs in a COVID-appropriate way, prioritising the safety and wellbeing of the young people at all times. There is lots of excitement brewing about the upcoming introduction of specialised youth Yoga classes, and a newly donated pool table was a recent welcome addiction for students in Tea Tree House.

A father's story

At the 2020 Graduation Ceremony we heard from a parent, who reflected on his daughter's recovery. This is an excerpt from his story...

Our daughter was a great kid, but she got mixed up with a bad and disturbed group of people at about the age of 17. No matter how much as parents we tried, we just couldn't get through to her.

We could see the writing on the wall. She was badly affected by drugs, moody and unable to have a conversation without it turning into a screaming match. This went on for quite a while.

Eventually we had the police at our door on a regular basis and we knew what path she was heading down and it wasn't good. It was a very worrying time for us.

It all came to a head when she was arrested.

After six months in jail, she was court ordered to a drug rehabilitation home in Sydney. What a disaster! She was left alone, unsupervised with other girls who were openly using drugs.

She rang me, begging me to do something about it, to get her out of that place. After that her mum called Triple Care Farm to see if they could help. What a difference!

The staff listened to what we had to say, understood what we were going through and said they would take our daughter into the rehab program.

She would do courses, get back on track and be with people who genuinely cared for her.

I remember one phone call from her. She sounded so happy. **She screamed down the phone, I learnt to drive a tractor! I cried – I hadn't heard my baby speak in such a way for a long time.** That made me feel like we were slowly getting her back."

This was a heart-warming time. Over the next three months, the horrible life that she was living had left her. She was starting to become ours again."

She is now happy, in a full time job and back on track. She often says 'I will never go back to that life again'.

I'd like to thank the staff at Triple Care Farm for all their help – you people are a godsend. Without you, there's no way she would be where she is today.

It's been uplifting to witness young people's voices being heard so prominently in the early weeks of 2021. From the USA's first youth poet laureate, Amanda Gorman's words of hope at the recent Presidential Inauguration, to Australian of the Year Grace Tame's message of strength and courage, both have used their platforms to great effect.

Twenty-six year old Ms Tame has spoken publicly about the abuse and trauma she suffered as a teen and her subsequent drug use and selfharm. How powerful it is for young people in our community to hear a survivor say 'you are not alone; you can speak up; help is available and you can transform your life'!

To that end, our Foundation is in the process of establishing a youth advisory group to ensure that a strong youth voice guides and influences our work. I look forward to announcing further details in coming months.
